ECL GETS UTO AWARD

The Episcopal Church of Liberia (ECL), a member of the Province of West Africa has been awarded a grant of US \$52,760.00(fifty two thousand, seven hundred sixty dollars) by the United Thank Offering (UTO).

In awarding the grant, the UTO Board Chair Madam Karin Elsen said please know that the Board and staff are excited to partner with the ECL in your important ministry and give thanks for your witness of Christ's love in the world.

The grant is to be used to provide safe drinking water to 400 vulnerable households (about 2,000 persons) residing around the Good Samaritan Episcopal Church and St. Thomas Episcopal Chapel in the Johnsonville community. The project will increase access to safe and clean drinking water and positively impact the wellbeing of the targeted population. The selection of the project and location is based on the serious difficulties faced by inhabitants accessing safe drinking water during the dry season (December – April) when wells are dried resulting to people sourcing water from polluted wells and nearby creeks.
